## The Most Ruthless Australian Who Ever Served..!!

Lawrence Dominic McCarthy was born in York WA on 21 January 1892. He was orphaned at a young age, was brought up in Clontarf Orphanage in Perth and educated in Catholic schools. After completing his schooling, from the age of 13 he worked on a farm as an apprentice near Northam, and later, he served with the 18th Light Horse, a Militia unit, for two and a half years.

#### Gallipoli and the Western Front..



McCarthy was initially rejected when he attempted to join the AIF however, he was later accepted after proving he had won a number of shooting competitions and enlisted on 16 October 1914. He was subsequently posted to the newly formed 16th Battalion. His large build later earned him the nickname "Fats".

After sailing for Egypt in December and further training, the 16th Battalion was landed late on 25 April 1915 at Gallipoli and reinforced the line at Pope's Hill on the second day of the campaign against the Turks. On 2 May it took part in the assault on 'Baby 700', a commanding position held by the Turks, which overlooked Australian positions in Monash Valley. The Battalion was tasked to take the 'Bloody Angle', the ridge above the right hand gully at the head of Monash Valley, between Pope's Hill and Quinn's Post.

16 Bn had landed with a strength of about 1000 men, but by dawn on the 3rd May, after the action at Baby 700, it numbered just 309. McCarthy survived the assault here and was promoted to corporal on 19 July.

The Battalion saw further action at Quinn's Post, and in the area towards Suvla, including the unsuccessful attack on Hill 971. In this action at one stage the left flank of the brigade was left entirely exposed where 'only severe fighting by the 16th Bn kept the Turks from enveloping the rear of the column.' The Battalion had suffered the loss of 118 officers and men.

On 1 September, McCarthy was promoted to sergeant though general debility caused his evacuation to Egypt nine days later and he did not rejoin his unit at Gallipoli until 13 November. He was then among the last in his battalion to leave Gallipoli on 20 December 1915, moving back to Egypt for rest and re-organising of the AIF.

The 16th Battalion arrived in France in June 1916 where they took part in the fighting against the Germans at Pozières and Mouquet Farm in August 1916. In January 1917, McCarthy was awarded the French Croix de Guerre for his services on Gallipoli and in France. He was promoted to CSM on 8 March. On 2 April he suffered a gunshot wound to the left arm in fighting near Bullecourt and was evacuated to England for treatment.

Rejoining his unit on 9 July 1917, he was promoted to lieutenant on 1 November. Between February and August 1918 he was posted to the 13th Training Battalion in England where he trained troops, before rejoining his battalion in time for the Allied Hundred Days Offensive that began on 8 August.

#### Victoria Cross action ..

On 23 August 1918, McCarthy performed what was later described in the official history as being the most effective piece of individual fighting in the history of the AIF, next to Albert Jacka's Military Cross-winning feat at Pozières.

Near Madame Wood, west of Vermandovillers, France, the Bn was heavily opposed by well-sited German machine-guns. A crisis suddenly developed in front of a British flanking unit, halting its advance preventing a link-up with the Australians. McCarthy, realizing the situation, dashed across the open ground with two men to the nearest machine-gun post, where, having out-distanced his companions, he put the gun out of action, then continued on his own fighting his way down the trench, throwing "bombs" and shooting his way through, dropping into a disused trench which had been blocked.



One of his two men was killed whilst doing this. He was now right under the block over which the enemy machinegun was firing. The presence of head cover prevented the use of bombs. He therefore tunnelled a hole through the bottom of the block, through which he inserted his head and one arm. He at once shot dead the two men firing the gun. He then crawled through the hole he had made, and by himself charged down the trench. He threw his limited number of Mills bombs among the German garrison and inflicted some more casualties. He then came in contact with two German officers, who fired on him. One of these he shot dead, the other he seriously wounded. He then charged down the trench using his revolver and throwing enemy stick bombs, and captured three more enemy machine-guns. At this stage, he was joined by Sgt Fred Robbins whom he had outdistanced earlier. Together they continued to bomb up the trench, until touch was established with the British unit that stabilised the situation. In the meantime yet another machine-gun had been captured


Having cleared up a dangerous situation, he proceeded to establish a garrison in the line. Whilst doing this he saw a number of the enemy escaping from neighbouring trenches. He seized a Lewis gun and inflicted further casualties on them. A total of 5 machine-guns and 50 prisoners (37 unwounded and 13 wounded) was captured, while Lieut. McCarthy during his most amazing and daring feat had, single-handed, killed 20 of the enemy.

The determined and daring conduct of this gallant officer saved a critical situation, prevented many casualties, and was mainly, if not entirely, responsible for the final objective being taken.

The 16th Battalion historian noted that the action was met with the most extraordinary reaction from McCarthy's prisoners. Far from further resistance, the Germans actually congratulated him on his feat. "The german prisoners closed in on him from all sides ... and patted him on the back!!"

For his actions in the taking of the trench, McCarthy was awarded the Victoria Cross. For his part in the same action Robbins was awarded a Distinguished Conduct Medal (DCM).

Within his battalion and in some quarters of the London press, McCarthy's VC award became to be known as the "Super-VC". Responding to the congratulations of a fellow officer McCarthy reportedly remarked; 'Oh, it was nothing. I jumped into a trench and got the fright of my life when I found that it was full of Fritzies.'









Ten days after the war ended, on 21 November 1918, McCarthy was evacuated to England with influenza, where he was informed that he had been awarded the VC for his August action. After recovering he rejoined 16th Bn on 7 January 1919, subsequently receiving the award from King George V at Buckingham Palace on 12 July 1919.

Later in 1919 the London Times released Volume XIX of its comprehensive history of the war. Of the Australians it notes; 'Nothing could exceed the daring and initiative of these oversea soldiers...' Contained within the volume is reference to McCarthy's actions which 'were of the bravest and most resolute description, and they were conspicuous even amongst the many extraordinary single-handed exploits of the war.'

Between March 1916 and November 1918 more than 295,000 Australians served in the Australian Imperial Force (AIF) in France and Belgium. Of these, some 46,000 lost their lives and some 131,000 were wounded.




#### Footnote:

McCarthy returned to Australia in December 1919, having married Florence Norville in January in London. He was demobilised in August 1920 and returned to WA. Moving to Victoria in 1926 with his wife, he was employed by the Sunshine Harvester Works as a commercial traveller and remained with them until 1934 when the company was forced to lay off staff during the Great Depression. He subsequently found new work with the *Trustees, Executors & Agency Co.* in Melbourne, and worked for that company until his retirement in 1969.

The couple's only son, Lawrence, was KIA fighting the Japanese on Bougainville on 20 May 1945.

**Lawrence Dominic McCarthy VC** died at the Repatriation General Hospital, Heidelberg in Melbourne in May 1975 and was cremated with full military honours.





This is a picture from the front cover of the RSL News several years ago. Back then it caught my attention. It's a picture of the smaller boats making their way to the beach at Gallipoli. I also found the original picture in Canberra at the museum

As Australia was still a young country back then, there were many emigrants from Ireland, Scotland and England.

The large round item being held on the boat is a Lambeg Drum. They are still made in Ireland and played regularly at competitions in Folk Drumming Clubs. They were carried into battle the same as the Scots played the bagpipes. The hides are made from Goat Skins usually captured in the Donegal Hills from wild goats. They have a fearsome sound and they are beaten with bamboo rods. My research has found that many of these drums were brought here by immigrants and hence why one ended up being taken to Gallipoli.

# Military invalidity pensions – Douglas decision

Work out if your military invalidity pension is affected by the Douglas decision and what it means for your tax.

# THE *DOUGLAS* DECISION

The Federal Court decision in <u>Commissioner of Taxation v Douglas [2020] FCAFC 220</u> (the *Douglas* decision) found that, from 1 July 2007, certain invalidity pension payments for veterans and their beneficiaries are superannuation lump sums, and not superannuation income stream benefits.

The vast majority of veterans will be in a better tax position due to the *Douglas* decision – paying less tax. Tax will increase for a small number of veterans.

As a result of the *Douglas* decision, a <u>veterans' superannuation (invalidity pension) tax offset</u> (VSTO) has been introduced to ensure veterans and their beneficiaries don't pay more tax because of the *Douglas* decision.

These trips take a lot to organise, and we have our Treasurer Heather and member Pauline to thank for organising them for us.


